Under the Area Based Childhood Programme, between 2014 and 2016, Preparing for Life will continue to support parents to get their children ready to start school through its home visiting and positive parenting programmes. 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Introducing the New Preparing For Life Programmes



Antenatal care and education is vital for good birth outcomes, we are working with our partners the Rotunda Hospital and the HSE to provide antenatal care and education classes in local health and community centres. This will make it easier for parents to engage with these services in their community.





Our family mentors work alongside parents from pregnancy to when a child starts school. We visit families in the home and give information on child development and parenting, with the aim of improving school readiness.

Youth Leadership Programme in Full Stride

The Youth Leadership Programme 2014 is now in full stride. Over the last three weeks our group of newly recruited young people have visited the Ombudsman for Children's Office (OCO) and The Dóchas Centre – a closed, medium security prison for women in Ireland. They have also participated in team building activities with Xtreme Adventure Centre in Courtlough, Dublin.

The group has gained a great understanding of children and young people's rights and responsibilities through their engagement with the OCO and have gained considerable insight into the role of the Irish Prison Service and the issues and responses used in conflict management.

Over the next five weeks they will meet with the Bar Council of Ireland and Northside Law Centre. As part of this session they will take part in a Moot Court and will learn about the art of public speaking and presentation skills. The group will also be hosted by the Dublin Airport Hilton Hotel for a workshop on the theme of "Team Dynamics and Event Management", in addition to Catapult Production Company around the theme of "Creativity and Innovation".



Young Community Innovators Set to Rock the Vote

Our Young Community Innovators are currently running an Activating Youth Vote project to get as many young people from North Dublin as possible to register and vote in the upcoming local and European elections this May. The group are officially affiliated with Rock the Vote.

This family fun day was the first in a series of Health Heroes events that Northside Partnership will run between April and November 2014 to encourage people of all ages living in Dublin 3, 5, 13 and 17 to lead more active and healthy lifestyles – and to have some fun along the way while doing so.

Among the community and sports groups who were on site providing demonstrations of their sports and hoping to sign up new members were Parnells GAA Club, Raheny Shamrocks Athletics Club, Dance X, Doras Bui / CHANGE Community Garden, Parnells Yoga, Parnells Pilates, Darndale Boxing Club and the Boys Brigade 29th Company.

The Health Heroes project is being run by a committee of nine young people who are graduates of Northside Partnership's Young Community Leaders programme.
