



Service Development Worker, Financial Capabilities (Full-time)

Northside Partnership wishes to recruit the position of Service Development Worker, Financial Capabilities on a full time, fixed term basis.

Research launched in 2020, conducted by the Think Tank for Action on Social Change (TASC) has found that in Ireland single-parent households, low-paid workers and unemployed persons have consistently higher rates of over-indebtedness and lower rates of financial capability than other household types.

Based on this research, Northside Partnership in partnership with TASC, have developed a financial capability training and coaching programme called Money Made Sense, the pilot of which was launched within the Northeast Dublin area.

As a result of the success of the pilot programme, Northside Partnership in conjunction with TASC now seeks to document the learning and practice approach of the programme *Money Made Sense* as it evolves. This best practice framework is intended as an implementation tool for the programme in the post pilot phase and takes account of two contexts for the roll-out of the programme: for delivery in a community and workplace setting. Drawing on the work of the programme, the framework will provide a blueprint for how the programme should be delivered to allow for the scalability and replication in other areas.
